TECHNICAL RIDER

1. General group and baggage options

1.1. The composition of the troupe

- 1.1.1. Actors of thetroupe:
 - Troupe of 30 people. (for example, "Swan Lake").
 - Troupe of 20 people ("Carnival", "Scheherazade").
 - Troupe of 4 people ("Pavan Moor").
- 1.1.2. Technical and administrative staff 2 people.
- 1.2. Production luggage
- 1.2.1. Baggage volume 10 cubic meters.
- 1.2.2. Baggage weight 800 kg.
- 1.3. Organizational matters

1.3.1. Tour schedule (including installation, disassembly, stage cleaning and rehearsals at the site), scene plan and light planning from the receiving party no later than 14 days before the start of the tour.

- 1.3.2. Travel troupe and baggage delivery the receiving party
- 1.3.3. Accommodation 2 separate rooms for soloists, double rooms the host

2. Requirements for the size and equipment of the scene

2.1. Scene mirror, minimum: width on portals - 12 m, height up to the upper portal arch has to be 8 m. The depth of the stage from the curtain line (not including the proscenium) is 13 m.

Performances at the venues smaller size require prior separate approval.

- 2.2. Scene's clothing is a black backdrop and 2 floor plans (1 and 2 plan).
- 2.3. At least 36 lifting shankets (at least 6 between soffits).
- 2.4. Maximum load on pillars: dotted 150 kg, dispersed 300 kg.
- 2.5. Stage cover: black ballet plastic.
- 2.6. A sufficient number of "loads" (at least 50) for the shipment and alignment of screens.

3. Communication system

3.1. At least two-channel communication system of Intercom type in all posts.

3.2. Possibility of notification from the post of assistant director to artistic dressing rooms and office premises of the theater.

3.3. Portable radios (such as Icom IC - 4008mk or equivalent) for operational communication.

4. Dressing rooms and staff rooms

- 4.1. Dressing rooms at the rate of no more than 8 people.
- 4.2. The presence of toilet rooms and showers (with hot and cold water) in the dressing rooms or on the floor (but not less than 2).
- 4.3. In the dressing rooms there should be a warning system for the assistant director.
- 4.4. A costume room with an ironing board and an iron with steamer, 4 racks for hanging costumes.
- 4.5. A drying room for drying suits.
- 4.6. Separate room for technical staff.
- 4.7. All rooms are equipped with door locks with keys.
- 4.8. A suit hanger 6 pcs.
- 4.9. Changing screens 2 pcs.

5. The schedule for the preparation of performances.

5.1. Scene and outbuildings should be ready in accordance with the rider for at least 9 hours before the start of the performance.

5.2. Production baggage must be delivered to the building in which the performance takes place, not later than 12 hours before the start of the performance.

5.3. For installation, dismantling and carrying out the performance, 2 installers are needed,

2 illuminators, 1 console operator (knowing local console), a local sound engineer,

an assistant director, a scene cleaner.

5.4. The presence of service technicians for installation and performance is necessary 10 hours before the start of the performance.

5.5. Technical staff must be delivered to the place of the performance no later than 10 hours before the start of the performance.

6. Sound

6.1. Acoustic systems

6.1.1. Portals:

MeyerSound MiloLineArray or equivalent (12 pcs.);

Meyer Sound 700 HP Sub or equivalent (2 pcs.);

Central cluster: Meyer Sound Milo 120 Line Array or equivalent;

6.1.2. Meyer Sound UPQ-1P stage scenic monitors or equivalent (4 pcs.)

6.2. Electronic equipment

6.2.1. Remote MIDAS LEGEND 3000 (or equivalent).

6.2.2. Acoustic processors with XTA 226 delay lines - 2 pcs.

6.2.3. Taskam MD 801 minidisc deck (or equivalent) - 2 pcs.

6.2.4. Connection via Di Box of audio output from the media server (output from sound card -mini-jack), which is in the backstage, on the audio console.

- 6.2.5. A set of low-current and power cables.
- 6.2.6. The console should be located in the center of the room or the control room,

where the 100% scene overview provided.

7. Light

- 7.1. Electric streamers or spotlights 4 pcs.
- 7.2. Devices for dynamic light SPOT 575 (Clay Paky) 12 pcs.
- 7.3. Profile devices ETC SOURCE FOUR 26 ° (spotlights) 6 pcs.
- 7.4. Profile devices ETC SOURCE FOUR 26 ° (remote soffits or bridges) 14 pcs.
- 7.5. Light filters in the catalog "LEE FILTERS" №201 for ETC SOURCE FOUR 6 pcs.
- 7.6. Remote control ROADHOG.
- 7.7. Smoke machines 2 pcs.

8. Suspension scenery (rigging)

- 8.1. Access to the grate space.
- 8.2. Suspension winch mechanisms.
- 8.3. Access to hoist lifts (if mechanical stankets are available).
- 8.4. 5-meter flat two-pipe trusses 2 pcs., 3-meter two-pipe trusses for screen hanger 2 pcs.

9. Attendants

The receiving party ensures the work of the following specialists:

- 9.1. Sound technicians 1 person.
- 9.2. The cameramen on the control panel 1 person.
- 9.3. Illuminators 4 people.
- 9.4. Electronic engineer (for lighting equipment) 1 person.
- 9.5. Electrical engineer (for connecting the power 3-phase part) 1 person.
- 9.6. Scene drivers with a repair kit (tools, hardware) 4 people.
- 9.7. Assistant Director 1 person.
- 9.8. Scene cleaner 1 person.
- 9.9. Mounters on hand-made shtaket at installation and dismantling of equipment 2 people.
